OUR FAITH

The story is told of a blind merchant selling his wares in the middle of a busy train station, when a group of children bump into the table and knock much of his nicely stacked merchandise to the floor. As the story goes, the merchant gets down on his hands and knees in an attempt to retrieve his scattered goods. Another man, clearly in a hurry, rounds the corner to see the sight-impaired merchant on the floor.

The man stops for a moment, looks at his watch, his expression indicating his dilemma: If he takes the time to help this young man, he will likely miss his train. With only a moment's hesitation, he drops his briefcase, gets down on the floor, and helps the merchant gather and re-stack his goods. When all is in order, and the man walks away, the merchant calls out after him: "Hey Mister, are you Jesus?"

This story could well be a modern-day parable. It comes to my mind each time I hear the Greeks say to Philip, as we hear in today's Gospel, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus."



POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO OUR HEARTS

("Lord, I Am Here") Remember what St. Paul says: "What shall I boast of, if not my weakness, my poverty?" (cf. 2 Corinthians 11:30). Precisely in feeling my sinfulness, in looking at my sins, I can see and encounter God's mercy, his love, and go to him to receive forgiveness. In my own life, I have so often seen God's merciful countenance, his patience. I have also seen so many people find the courage to enter the wounds of Jesus by saying to him, "Lord, I am here; accept my poverty, hide my sin in your wounds, wash it away with your blood." And I have always seen that God did just this — he accepted them, consoled them, cleansed them, loved them.
